Like tributaries, these events stem from the great river of humanity which is the largest May Day Parade on this island. Educate – Exhibitions, walking tours and talks from academic activists.

Agitate – Carnival arts workshop and performances from the upcoming generation of trade unionists. Celebrations of our music and poetry.

Organise – The point of trade unionism, empowering working people by lobbying for Good Jobs legislation, defending the rights of the marginalised and welcoming every person who can add to our confection of humanity.

Most of all, have fun.

Tradition can often be mistaken for something fixed, something to be preserved unchanged. Yet the traditions that matter, in the arts, in community life, and in the labour movement, have never stood still. They have always been shaped and renewed by people responding to the pressures, the ambitions and the possibilities of their time.

This year's programme reflects that renewal in very real ways and the partnerships behind the Festival. Young people from communities throughout the city have not simply learned about the history of collective action, they have interpreted it, reimagined it, and made it visible through their own creative work. On May Day itself, that work moves from the workshop to the street, the performance space and theatre, from idea to public expression, reminding us that culture is not passive, it is made and remade through participation.

For the arts locally, this moment is critical. In a time of uncertainty, where structures of support can feel increasingly fragile, the role of creative practice becomes harder to maintain but all the more necessary. The arts provide a space where people can understand change, question it, and shape it. They offer a language through which communities can articulate both their concerns and their ambitions. They offer all of us a voice to help express our disappointment, joy and outrage with our world.

For the labour movement, Traditions in Transition speaks to continuity of shared community purpose. The core values of solidarity, fairness and collective voices remain as urgent as ever. What changes is how those values are expressed, who is included within them, and how new generations come to claim them as their own.

What is particularly powerful about our May Day Festival programme is the way these strands come together. The march and rally, the workshops, the exhibitions, the music and performances, all form part of a single conversation. They connect heritage with lived experience, and reflection with action.


In the times we are living through, that connection matters. It reminds us that the future is not something that happens to us. It is something we make, together, drawing on what has come before, and reshaping it for what comes next.

*"War is a game played by maniacs who kill each other. Locate the man who profits by war and strip him of his profits - war will end." – Woody Guthrie*



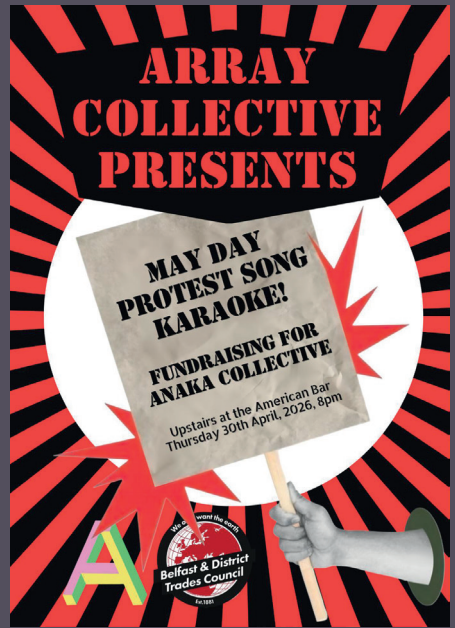

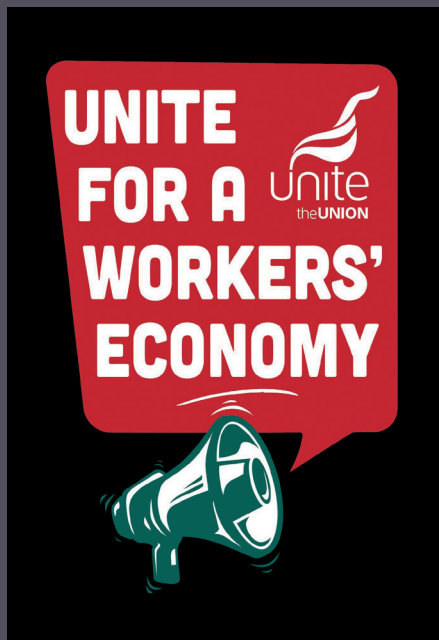

## WALKING TOUR OF RADICAL BELFAST WITH LABOUR HISTORIAN JOHN GRAY

Led by local radical and labour historian John Gray, this tour of radical Belfast will follow in the footsteps of the United Irishmen when Belfast was the most revolutionary centre in the British Isles. 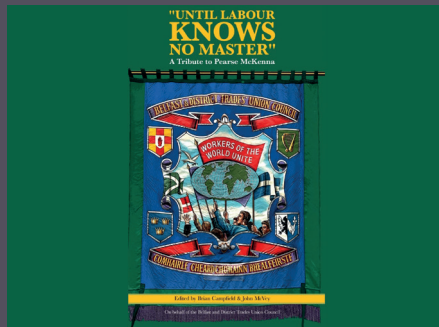

To commemorate the passing of a former President of the Belfast Trades Union, Pearse McKenna, the Council have commissioned a publication *“Until Labour Knows No Master”*. The pamphlet includes contributions from activists and academics both local and international with articles a range of subject areas including international solidarity, imperialism, the Troubles and the ongoing challenge of increasing violence against women and girls.

Pearse who passed away in 2025 was a stalwart trade unionist was dedicated to the cause of anti sectarianism. His work in this area led to a failed

assassination attempt by the Ulster Freedom Fighters in 1991 after he had made a stand to promote a workplace free from sectarian symbols and flags, as an ATGWU shop steward in Ormeau Bakery.

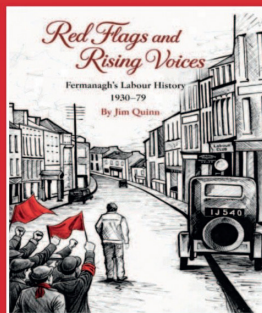

## **WALKING TOUR: STARS AND STRIKES**

It also draws attention to light pollution and ways to address it.

We will stop briefly at a number of sites to attempt to see the Starry Plough, asking participants to recall memories of industrial action associated with that particular site.

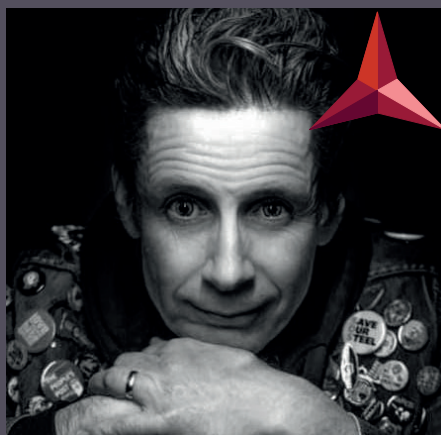
